Inspiration for all

We are all very different in what inspires us but a love of hostas usually coincides with an appreciation of the environments they suit best.

Secret, shady spaces, from hidden narrow alleyways to wooded glades are some of the environments I find particularly interesting and was delighted to see the progress made in the garden at Columbine Hall recently – see photo above.

Kate and Hew came to the nursery at the end of 2022 hunting for plain leaved hostas to add to their scheme and I was eager to see how it was all progressing. We had the perfect opportunity when David and I had a stall at the Hall on their recent Open Day in aid of St Elizabeth's Hospice.
